


Reading Newsletter Spring 2024

Welcome to our termly newsletter which we hope will give you some ideas of books to read, as well as keeping you up to date with reading events and competitions.






<u>Dread Wood - Jennifer Killick</u> The Dread Wood series - which I highly recommend to read - is a thrilling ride of 5 books. I'll be mainly talking about the first book but they are equally exhilarating. (The fifth one was released in January 2024.

In Dread Wood, the story takes place in Dread Wood High where Angelo, Naira, Gus and Hallie are in detention - detention on a SATURDAY! They all think that this is the worst thing ever but things end up way worse and seriously scary. Who or what dragged their teacher underground? Why do the creepy caretakers keep humming the tune of incey wincey spider and what is lurking in the shadows waiting for revenge. There is only one way to find out - get this heart-stopping book today!

Soon to become a film, this lovely book explores what happens when nature and technology collide and would be suitable for children (and adults!) from Y3 upwards.


Miss Brogan's Book recommendation

The Highland Falcon Thief

I bought this book for my son when M G Leonard visited our school as she recommended it to me for a Year 4 child who likes adventures... and boy was she right!

The story starts with Harrison Beck going on the final train journey of The Highland Falcon steam train with his Uncle Nat. The train travels up to the Highlands of Scotland and on the journey, a priceless brooch is stolen. This story was full of mystery and suspense and we loved reading together and trying to guess, 'Who did it!'

My son and I have gone onto read the next books in the series, which have been brilliant and I have to say book 5 Sabotage on the Solar Express (which we are currently reading) has been the most exciting!

Author visits normally cost schools hundreds of pounds but we are able to offer these events free of charge to all pupils.

On Thursday 7th March, we will be celebrating World Book Day across our school. We will be celebrating diversity in books and reminding children how special they are as individuals. As always, we want the focus of the day to be books and 'reading for pleasure' and we would rather that you did not have to purchase expensive costumes. Consequently, we are asking children to wear their pyjamas. This has been very popular in recent years and it also serves as a lovely reminder that you are never too old for a bedtime story. This year, we ask for a voluntary contribution of £1 and we will use every penny of this to purchase books for class libraries.

Monday 4th March

Last year, we introduced the World Book Day Bake Off and as it was such a resounding success, we would like to include it in our celebrations again. All children are invited to bring in a cake or small cakes or biscuits with a bookish theme - we had everything from Harry Potter cupcakes to Queen of Hearts' jam tarts in 2023. There will be year group category prizes awarded for the most imaginative designs and all the cakes will be sold afterwards with profits going back into the school fund to buy books for the children. Please bring cakes, in a labelled container, to the hall on the morning of Monday - there will be tables set up for each year group. Please do not use nuts or any nut products in any of the cakes. If your child would like to buy cakes, they may wish to bring in a small amount of money on Monday 4th March when cakes will be on sale at breaktime and lunchtime.
