
Dinglewell Junior School Sport Premium

Background

- In April 2013 the Government announced new funding for Primary PE and School Sport
- The Sport Premium can only be spent on sport and PE provision
- The purpose of the funding is to improve the quality and breadth of PE and School Sport, to help pupils develop healthy lifestyles and enable them to reach their sporting potential

Ensure Year Groups are hosting inter-year group competitions. Children more active in school time/enjoying being part of a competitive team

- Staff meeting in November 23 to decide which competitions will be held within year groups and when - ongoing
- Remind YGLs of timetabled **Events/Monitor competitions** being held – ongoing
- Active 30 relaunched in November 23's staff meeting. Explain aims and benefits. Other activities provided at lunchtimes, facilitated by Playground Friends skipping/running/ball games.
- PE shed to be sorted, cleaned and organised. Labels to be printed and organised by lessons rather than types of resources
- Monitor and order as necessary

- All children achieving their active 30. All children regularly participating in Active Blasts/Go Noodle/The Daily Mile. Children more active in school time
- Check Active Blasts/Go Noodle/The Daily Mile is being conducted by all classes
- Provide lunchtime soft football/rugby balls

- All year groups holding at least 1, or often 2 intra year group competitions.
- Intra-school gymnastics competition took place June 23
- Intra-school Cross-Country competition took place October 23
- Sports day Summer 2023 amended to include separate SEND provision, more group based games and tighter safeguarding.

Continue to ensure all year groups host intra-school competitions – closer monitoring necessary

- Go Noodle used by many classes during inclement weather. The Daily Mile was conducted when possible by most classes. Not all classes using Active Blasts.
- lunchtime soft football/rugby balls ordered and distributed
- Give regular reminders to staff to use during inclement weather
- Order more playtime resources when required







• Ensure there are sufficient PE resources to support the new scheme. Resources to be kept in their correct place. To help facilitate quality PE lessons/sports clubs

- Conduct audit of PE resources and order replacements/new resources
- Tidy and organise PE shed
- Ask staff not to allow children in PE shed
- Update PE inventory

- PE resources ordered and delivered to PE shed/club leaders
- PE shed still becomes untidy and difficult to locate resources
- Resources bought included tennis balls, leather footballs, general replacements, foam footballs/rugby balls for playtimes
